

## **Intervention Services for Speech/Language**

Intervention services may be offered by the SLP as appropriate.

### **Guidelines:**

1. There are currently no strict guidelines for interventions services provided by an SLP.
2. An SLPs first priority must be given to IEP students. Intervention services may be offered when his/her schedule allows.
3. The SLP most commonly provides intervention services for articulation, phonemic awareness, language development or vocabulary/language support for an ESL student.
4. Some students demonstrate an articulation disorder (typically 1-2 speech sounds) but there is no adverse effect on their ability to learn or participate in the general education curriculum. Intervention services would be appropriate in these cases.
5. Intervention services can be provided during the problem-solving process to see how the student responds to the interventions. They can also be provided after the student has been dismissed from S/L IEP services when there is no adverse effect, but some progress can still be made in therapy.
6. Signed parent/guardian consent must be obtained for intervention services.
